2:45-2:55 pm	1:45-1:55 pm	Using gText in the Classroom	Communication is key to success in the classroom and out. gText allows you to keep in touch with students and parents through texting without giving out your real phone number, gText allows you to send text messages to groups that you have created in your gText account. Your texts can be sent from your phone or from your computer. By default gText keeps group members' phone numbers private. Group members who want other group members to see their numbers can allow that. Beyond simple text messaging gText offers options for sharing files (although that could consume a lot of space on a phone), sharing images, and sharing calendars. Students can text you questions and you can quickly reply (they won't email you, that's so 20th century!). Keep parents updated with what is going on in your classroom or school	Patti Oakley
